Cleanliness is at the top of the list

Make a commitment to clean – the new traveller will expect a spotless welcome

Commit to clean!.

Make sure you have at least a few hours to clean – especially public areas, bathrooms, kitchens and guest rooms.





Step 1: PrepareCleaning safety tips





Step 1: Prepare





Wait a day before accepting a new guest



Open windows and turn on fans



Wash hands for 20 seconds with soap and warm water – sing "Happy Birthday" twice



Make sure you have all your equipment ready.



Before starting, put on a mask, apron, gloves, and shoe covers



Collect all your cleaning supplies including disinfectant but be careful with chemicals!

Clean first Then sanitize





Cleaning means removing dirt and dust from surfaces in the kitchen, tables and chairs.



Sanitizing means using chemicals to reduce the bacteria. Anything with alcohol over 60% will kill the virus that causes COVID-19. Be careful with chemicals and make sure you sanitize surfaces that are touched like door handles.



Step 2: Clean dust and dirt

Remove all trash and use new bags.



Clean all the floors



Clean sheets, towels and all linens.



Clean table tops, kitchen surfaces and door handles



Make sure all dishes and cooking utensils are washed and clean.



Remove all dust from any surface.

Step 3: Sanitize

Disinfect





Step 3: Sanitize & Disinfect





Now you have finished cleaning – wipe with a strong disinfectant (No! Vinegar is not strong enough)



Don't wipe dry



Follow the directions and leave the disinfectant on long enough to work.



If you use paper towels – use a new one for each surface



Step 4: Review

Everything that is touched!





Step 4: Review



*

Check to make sure that all surfaces touched by you or guests are sanitized.



While you are checking and sanitizing fix problems – such as replacing light bulbs.



Check every room.



If you are running out of cleaning and disinfecting material, make a list and buy more.

Step 5: Check the guest rooms





Step 5: Check Guest Rooms





Before you put new towels, sheets or any guest supplies in the room wash your hands and put on gloves first.



Make the guest feel safe. Leave a small cleaning package – paper towels, disinfectant and soap.



Finished? Shut the door, disinfect the door handle and don't go in.



Print out a summary for the guest on how you cleaned!

- Door handles
- Light switches

Cleaning supplies



Make sure you have enough!

- > Surface cleaner
- > Surface disinfectant
- ➤ Glass cleaner
- > Bleach
- > Laundry detergent
- Dishwashing detergent
- > Carpet cleaner
- > Floor cleaner
- > Furniture/wood polish
